Large trophy awards were given on the basis of the decision of five judges for greatest Distance Flown, Most Outstanding Design and Most Outstanding Workmanship. Jack MacRae and Ray Nelson, both coming from the same airport in New York, tied for that award, and duplicate trophies

were awarded. Neal Loving won the Design award hands down, and Richard Schroeder of Toledo, Ohio, received the Workmanship award for his little all-metal "Air Mate".

Under the circumstances, we feel that we did very well, what with drawing over thirty aircraft, and almost five - hundred members. Everyone had a good time, and we attracted about sixty new members. From all indications, next year's fly-in should be much bigger and better.
